...ING A SISTER CITY AFFILIATION WITH JENA, EAST GERMANY.

WHEREAS, the hope for world peace is bringing the cities of the world closer; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for greater understanding between the cities of differing economic and political systems; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berkeley has a very proud tradition of supporting efforts to promote peace and understanding in the world; and

WHEREAS, Berkeley and Jena, both University cities, share a liberal tradition and a commitment toward developing the sciences, arts and literature, sports and protecting the natural environment.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Berkeley hereby establishes Jena, East Germany as a Sister City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that members of the Peace and Justice Commission work with all Berkeley's Sister Cities, including Jena, to the end that they will become Nuclear Free zones.
